

Integrated Processing Development Scheme (IPDS)

Government of India, Ministry of Textiles (MoT)

Scheme Summary/key features:

This scheme is designed to counter challenges such as non-availability of water for processing and environmental pollution caused by the discharge of untreated effluents. Considering the widespread prevalence of small and medium enterprises in this sector, IPDS will develop parks with common facilities such as effluent treatment plants and water supply systems that can be used by clusters of processing units. The focus areas are: Adequate and timely supply of water, Wastewater

•Eligibility:

The eligible projects under the scheme would cover the following:

- Common Effluent Treatment Plant (CETP),
- Captive power generation on technology preferably renewable/green technology,
- Infrastructure such as storm water management, necessary roads and pipelines for water & wastewater and
- Facility for testing and R&D centres.

Amount or Percentage of Subsidy:

The project cost shall be borne by the Centre, State, Beneficiary, Bank loan in the ratio of 50:25:15:10 respectively. The release will be made as per the following:

- Beneficiary contribution through equity of 15 percent of project cost shall be brought up front
- 10 percent funding to be arranged through Bank Loans 25 percent contribution of State Government at the time of release of 2nd instalment of GOI Grant released.
- The GOI grant (50% of the total Project cost) shall be released in 3 instalments –
- 50 percent of the GOI grant to be released initially after beneficiary contribution (1st instalment)
- 30 percent of the GOI grant once the plant is operational (2nd instalment)
- 20 percent GOI grant once the plant has been run for 3 years (3rd instalment)

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
